Education is the centerpiece of the multi-disciplinary approach to community and individual empowerment. Programs are developed with local schools in response to educational needs.



Youth and Family Literacy Programs

Work alongside teachers in the classroom or in after-school and summer programs to increase reading, writing and math skills of students. Involve families in the education of their children and provide parents the opportunity to meet their own literacy-related goals.



English Language Clubs and Camps

English language skills can provide a passport out of poverty through increased access to employment. Work in after-school clubs or summer camps to provide youth with a supportive and fun learning environment for English as a second language.



Young Authors' Workshops

Collaborate with educators to involve older youth in writing and illustrating books for younger children. Older youth improve writing skills; teach, inspire and improve reading skills of younger children; and play an important role in building a permanent library of meaningful literature for school and community use.



Health Literacy Programs

Facilitate programs involving children's literature and health promotion. Coordinate book-related activities to improve reading skills while enhancing the understanding of health topics such as good hygiene practices and safe drinking water.
